As a matter or courtesy, he was permitted to use the first half of the meeting to outline his company's policy and plans for future improvements. This of course took up some time, but the majority of listeners felt he put his points very well.

This talk, together with some further explanations from Miss Fran Garthwaite of Essex County Council, made a lot of issues much clearer for all concerned.

At the end of the evening, several major breakthroughs had been made, namely, the Managing Director and County Council representatives have suggested that they return to the Village for another meeting in three months' time, so that any improvements they envisage, based on public points raised at the meeting on the 21st, will have time to be implemented, and they can return to hear our further comments.

The second half was given over to question and answer, and the discussion of complaints led, not least, to a promise by Mr Richard Walker of Colchester Borough Council, to investigate our list of complaints about the bus station, and look into ways and means of improving the area.

Report from Kevin Bentley, County Councillor for East Donyland, part of the Stanway and Pyefleet Division

Improving the turning into Rowhedge

I recently met with representatives from East Donyland Parish Council and Fingringhoe Parish Council, along with my Borough Councillor colleagues and Highway Officers to discuss improving the safety at the junction of the old Walnut Tree pub.

We exchanged views about traffic speeds travelling to and from Fingringhoe and also the safety of vehicles slowing to turn into Rowhedge or those trying to exit the junction. This has been a dangerous junction for some years and as vehicle numbers grow, it is something we are all mindful of for the future.

We have asked for a speed survey to be undertaken so that we, your elected representatives at Parish, Borough and County level, can gauge the level and speed of traffic and we are expecting the results of these sometime after the summer. I will report back on the findings of these in future editions of Donyland Dispatches.

We have no promises about what the improvements can be until Officers at Highways look at proposals in more detail but we all hope the survey will provide some very clear evidence that work is essential at this location for everyone concerned.

Proposed Riverside Heritage Centre

The new Centre has attracted considerable attention over the last few months and the Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to update you on the current situation.

Progress on the new Centre has continued well over the last twelve months albeit sometimes not always as speedily as the Parish Council would like.

East Donyland Parish Council applied for and was awarded two grants which totalled £40,000, over a period extending from 2004 - 2006. £20,000 was received from Colchester Borough Council's Town and Parish Grant Scheme with the second £20,000 grant coming jointly again from the Town and Parish Grant Scheme and the Essex County Council's Community Initiative Fund. To date approximately £24,000 has been spent on various services:

 Flood Risk Assessment – required by the Rowhedge Heritage Trust (RHT) in order for them to obtain extended planning permission for the current Heritage Centre.

- Topographical Survey required by the architects to establish correct site levels.
- Install Services to Site water / electricity to the site to enable the RHT to run the Centre more effectively.
- Architect Fees paid to Stanley Bragg Architects who were recommended by Essex County Council to the Parish Council.

The Council has agreed a concept design mindful of advice received from the Planning Department. The Parish Council has spent significant time ensuring that only one planning application will be made as each planning application carries a cost implication.

The Parish Council is currently in communication with Trinity Construction Consultancy Ltd obtaining costs for building the new

Centre. The Council is very aware of the need to encapsulate modern concerns with regard to construction materials, green issues, carbon footprint, etc. and the costings will reflect these concerns.

The results of previous public consultations reflected a desire for a more modern approach to be given to the new centre. The design which has been agreed mirrors these consultation findings, in that it is a modern, light, unobtrusive building which is also sympathetic to the local area. With this in mind, the Parish Council have taken on board advice from people such as the Urban Designer regarding environmental impact, green issues, parking and materials.

This design unfortunately has not met with the approval of the RHT who have recently commissioned their own architect to create an alternative design which will be publicly exhibited in September and people should keep an eye on the notice boards for more details.

Have your say!

Can I please give a big thumbs-up to St Lawrence School for allowing the Book Swap to happen every term time Monday afternoon.

It's a great free resource for all of us in the Village and there is a healthy range of recent books on their shelves. Children's books are available as well as all sorts of adults' and it saves most of us a trip to the library, or a wait for the library bus.



Update from the Rowhedge Allotment Association

In December 2009, some twenty-six people turned up to a meeting in the upstairs room of the Albion Pub in response to a poster placed on the Village notice boards asking 'Would you be interested in having an allotment if there were some in Rowhedge?'

Over the past six months, a group of residents have met regularly to discuss how to make this happen and we are making progress. So far, we have:

- Identified a piece of land, just off Weir Lane, and we are in the process of sorting out a lease for 2 acres to be used for allotments
- Formed ourselves into the Rowhedge Allotment Association (RAA) with a Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and Committee
- Tried to reach as many people as possible, through posters on the village notice boards, a newsletter at the recent Civic event and information at the Regatta
- Reached an agreement that the Parish Council will hold the lease on the land for the RAA – a condition of the owners
- A quote from Anglia Water to get water connected to the

- perimeter of the field and the Parish Council have agreed a grant to help us with the cost
- Started the process of writing applications for funding to help with the cost of getting water to the proposed plots, fencing and clearing the land
- Agreed that we will affiliate with the National Society of Allotment and Leisure Gardeners – who will give us the benefit of their advice on setting ourselves up.

There has been growing interest (no pun intended) and we now have 40+ people who have expressed an interest in having a plot.

To make sure the plots are allocated fairly, the RAA have adopted a policy which basically states that plots will be allocated in date order of when people said they were interested, together with the payment of a £10 per person membership fee.

First priority will be for residents of Rowhedge.
